PRAMATHESH BARUA COLLEGE: A PROFILE



Pramathesh Barua College (P. B. College), Gauripur began its tryst with destiny on the 1st day of June 1964 to put forward the intellectual and cultural ethos of Gauripur in the erstwhile Goalpara District of lower Assam. Christened after the proud son of Gauripur, Rajkumar Pramathesh Chandra Barua, this institution of Higher Education took its strides with luminaries like Prof. Alokesh Barua, Dr. Birendranath Dutta and galloped to prosperity under academic administrators of repute such as Dr. Krishna Kanta Bora, Prof.

Jayanta Kumar Chakraborty and Prof. Ganga Sankar Pandey. The College cherishes the proud distinction of producing many reputed academicians, administrators, social activists and successful businessmen who have variously contributed to nation building.

Initially started with the support of the people of the region and financial assistance from the Zamindar family of Gauripur, this co-educational institution of higher education was subsequently taken over by the Govt. of Assam under deficit grant-in-aid system in 1969. It got permanent affiliation by the Gauhati University and was recognized under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1956.

The College imparts teaching in Higher Secondary (+2 level) and Degree (+3 level) in two streams — Arts and Commerce. To face the emerging challenges in trade and commerce, the College started the Commerce Stream in 1979, which was first of its kind in Dhubri district. At present the college has sixteen teaching departments with a healthy 1.25 teacher learner ratio. Moreover, we are going to start some new courses such as BBA, BCA, PGDCA and PG in Assamese from the current academic session. The academic excellence of this institution was reckoned by NAAC in 2004 (Grade S') and further boosted its ranking with Grade 'B' (CGPA: 2.42) in 2015.

Although more than 60% of its students come from economically unprivileged section and from a multi-racial and multi-lingual catchment area sharing international borders with Bangladesh, this College has been able to earn accolades for its untiring pursuit for the intellectual and personal development of its students. Students are also mentored to counter the socio-cultural deficit and ensure their holistic development. Not with standing nagging hurdles like lack of infrastructure, basic amenities, paucity of funds and sound academic freedom, this institution has been able to make an identity of its own by sensitizing itself to new modes of teaching learning experience, continuous academic progress, and greater community participation.

Pramathesh Barua College is committed to institutionalize the culture of quality and ensure academic accountability while pursuing its continued journey for excellence.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Admissions into the College are notified in the College notice board and the Institutional website www.pbcollege.in.net
- 2. The College enrols students in B.A. / B.Com. programme under FYUGP. The college also enrols students in H.S. Arts and Commerce Stream. Besides, the interested students can enrol in Professional Course like PGDCA and Add-on Certificate Courses in Spoken English and Computer Application.
- Admission to any programme is based on merit. A common merit list of all applicants is prepared by the College for each programme and admission is made strictly on the basis of the merit list prepared. Govt. policy on reservation shall be maintained.
- Candidates seeking admission in various programmes shall have to apply in prescribed Application Form through online process available in the college website www.pbcollege.co.in
- Students will have to clearly indicate their subject combinations in the specified column of the Application Form. No request for change in combinations after admission shall be entertained.
- 6. Application Form completed in all respects must be submitted online on or before the last date of submission. Incomplete application form will be summarily rejected. The College shall not entertain any application for admission after the last date for submission is over.
- Applications Form must accompany the scanned copies of the Marksheet, Certificate, Admit Card (for age proof) of the last qualifying Examination and Caste Certificate, Gap Certificate whenever necessary.
- 8. The list of selected students will be available in the College website www. pbcollege.co.in
- 9. The Admission Committee may refuse admission to any candidate whose documents are found not genuine or not in proper order.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

The College follows the norms of students' regular attendance in classes. Attendance of this students in classes as well as in academic activities in mendatory which shall be counted and published in every month by each of the department of the college.

Only those students who attend minimum 75% and above in each individual subject in the Higher Secondary (Both 1st & 2nd year) classes shall be allowed to appear at the AHSEC Examination.

Similarly, students of every semester course who attend the classes of minimum 75% and above in each individual subject shall only be allowed to appear as regular candidates of the University examinations.

Students failing to attend minimum 75% of total classes taken in a session shall not be allowed to appear in the examinations as per Gauhati University rules nor will be they eligible to apply for any scholarship or contest in the Students' Union Election as per recommendation of Shri J.M Lyngdoh Commission to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.



EXISTING STUDENTS' EVELUATION PROCESS

Evaluation process of students' performance in B.A./B.Com. classes shall be based on the regulations/guidelines of Gauhati University as framed from time to time.

However, students' performance shall be assessed through a continuous evaluation mechanism comprising.

1. Under CBCS Curriculum

- (A) **External Examination**, carrying 80% weightage, which shall be conducted by the university at the end of each semester, and
- (B) **Internal Examinations** that carry 15-20% weightage of maximum marks. Students must note that the university has made it mandatory for all students to secure at least 30% marks in the internal assessment to be successful in the final examination

2.Under FYUGP Curriculum

- (A) **External Evaluation**, carrying 60% weightage, which shall be conducted by the university at the end of each semester, and
- (B) Internal Evaluation, carry 40% weightage of maximum marks.

(A) External Evaluation:

- 1. B.A./B.Com. courses shall be of six (6) semesters covering three calendar years. The general schedule for semester system is given below:-
 - a) Odd Semesters (1st, 3rd and 5th) 1st June to 30th November (Including Examinations)
 - b) Even Semesters (2nd, 4th and 6th) 1st December to 30th May (Including Examinations)
 - c) Semester Break/Summer Vacation 1st July to 31st July.
- 2. A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester Examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - a) 1st Semester with the regular 3rd Semester Examination.
 - b) 2nd Semester with the regular 4th Semester Examination.
 - c) 4th Semester with the regular 6th Semester Examination.

- 3. A student must pass all his / her Semester Examination including 'Repeat' and Betterment' chances within 6 (six) years from the date of admission/registration to the 1st Semester course. A student will get maximum three (3) chances to clear a particular semester.
- 4. Allthough 75% of attendance is mandatory, a student of any Honours course who remains absent for 10(ten) consecutive teaching days, except on genuine medical ground shall forfeit his / her seat. However submission of appeals, if any, on medical ground shall have to be forwarded by the concerned Head of the Department.
- 5. A student may be allowed to 'Repeat' any one of the Major papers in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Semester.
- 6. No 'Repeat' shall be allowed in 4th, 5th and 6th Semester.
- 7. Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private / non collegiate candidate in any subject.
- 8. No College transfer is allowed except in case of parents transfer of service.
- 9. For any atter not covered under this Regulation for Semester System the existing University Rules and the Gauhati Universoty Act 1949 (as amended till date) shall be applicable.
- 10. 75% attendance in classes is compulsory. Students failing to comply to this requirement will have to face disciplinary action including penalty.

(B) Procedure for existing internal evaluation:

As per Regulation of Three years Degree Course (TDC) Semester system with credit and Grade Continued in Academic Council meeting held on 27th October, 2017 the mark alloted for internal evaluation in each paper will be based on the following:

- a) Sessional Examination: 50% of the total internal marks of each paper.
- b) Home assaignment Seminar / Co-curricular and Class Attendance above 75% and 50% of the total internal marks of each paper.

Internal Evaluation which carries 20, 15 and 10 maximum marks in respective subjects as per the allotment of syllabus which has been broken up in the following ways:

Students showing discourtesy to the Teachers and employees in any form, adopting unfair means in Examination Hall, using Mobile Phone in class room and Examination Hall, damaging College property shall be liable for disciplinary action. The decision of the Governing Body on all matters relating to Students indiscipline shall be final and binding.

- 2. All Students should read the College Notice Board / college websiteb regularly for getting the up to date information's.
- 3. Maintenance of Cleanliness in the college campus should be a habitual practice. Throwing of any waste material in the college campus is strictly prohibited. Students need to develop their habit to use dustbins of the campus.

1. Student must abide by rules and regulation of the College, Violation of which shall invite disciplinary action against them. STUDENTS' UNION (ELECTION)

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in its order dated 22nd September 2006 directed the recommendations of Shri J. M. Lyngdoh Committee to be followed for conducting Students' Union Election in all colleges / universities of India (Elections). A system of direct election of the Office Bearers to the Students' Union of P.B. College shall be devised in strict adherence to the Court's order.

- 1. Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 only can contest the election.
- The candidate must be a regular full time student of the college and should not be a distant/proximate education student. That is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full time course whose duration being at least one year.
- 3. A candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- 4. The candidate should have the minimum percentage of attendance in classes as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.
- 5. The Candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of Office Bearer.
- 6. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he/she should not have been tried and or convicted of any offence or misdemeanour. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the college authorities.
- 7. The maximum permitted expenditure per candidate shall be Rs.5000/-
- Each candidate shall, within two weeks of the declaration of the result submit complete and audited accounts to the college authorities.
- 9. The election of the candidate will be nullified in the event of any non compliance or in the event of any excessive expenditure.
- 10. The use of loudspeakers, vehicle and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited.
- 11. No candidate shall indulge in, nor shall abet, any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students.
- 12. No candidate shall be permitted to make use of printed posters, printed pamphlets, or any other printed material for the purpose of canvassing. All Candidates shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting, all activities which are considered to be 'Corrupt Practices' and offences, such as bringing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersonation of voters canvassing or the use of propaganda within 100 meters of polling station.
- 13. It is also recommended that certain provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Section 153A and Chapter IXA – "Offences Relating to Election"), may also be made applicable to student elections.

14. Where the atmosphere of the College campus is adverse to the conduct of peaceful, free and fair elections, the College shall initiate a system of student representation based on nominations, especially where elections are being held at present.

STUDENTS' WELFARE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

1. Hostel Facilities for Girls:

The P.B.College girls hostel is a home away from home for the students. Along with well furnished rooms, the hostel also has a library and recreation facilities for the girl students. The students are encouraged to engage in cultural and literary activities by organizing freshers and farewell get togethers as well as prepairing wall magazines at regular intervals. Hostel students are expected to participate actively in various college activities. The fees for students per academic session is Rs. 5000.





2. Hostel Facilities for Boys:

The college has established a boys hostel at Lalji Campus, Matiabag for SC, ST and OBC students. The well furneshed hostel has teereational facilities and is in close vicinity of Indoor sports complex. In case the seats remain unfulfilled, it will be open to students of other categories. The fees for students per academic session is Rs. 5000.

3. Digital Class Room:

The College has set up a sophisticated Digital Class Room with smart board and digital monitor facilities. The students as well as the teachers are highly benefited by using facility and by connecting themselves with the larger academic world beyond the physical limitation of the campus.



4. Language Laboratory: This Laboratory contributes or provides language proficiency course such as spoken English, group discussion, personality development etc.

5. Computer Laboratory:

The College has well equipped computer laboratory having 40 (forty) numbers of commuters for promoting computer proficiency among the Students in general as well as for introducing courses like BCA and PGDCA in particulars.



6. Scholarship:

There is a provision of Scholarship for the Regular students of both Higher Secondary and Degree classes who are regular and punctual in their Classes.

- a) Scholarship for the students belonging to the SC / ST / OBC and Minority Communities.
- b) Poor Fund facilities are also provided by the College to the students belonging to the BPL group provided he/she should produce BPL certificate.
- c) The Assam Government provides financial assistant to the poor and needy Students time to time when it is deserved and College Circulates such information to the Students for the benefits of the concerned Students.

7. Pure-Drinking Water with Central Cooler System:

The College provides pure-drinking water for the Students, Teachers and emp-loyees in each floor of the College building with a Cooler System.

8. Internal Complaints Committee:

The college has an Internal Complaints Committee Comprising of senior teaching and non teaching members along with student representatives. All kinds of grievances and complaints pertaining to harassment cases within the college campus will be addressed to this Committee which will look into the matter maintaining secrecy and dispose the same within the stipulated period of time.





9. NCC Unit: There is a National Cadets Corps (NCC) unit at P.B. College, Gauripur. The stduents (both boys & girls) may get enrolled as Cadet of the NCC unit of the College. The NCC Cadets are enrolled in the beginning of every academic session, The cadets are trained as per the training procedure of 7th Assam Bn. NCC Dhubri. NCC "B" and "C" Certificate Examinations are conducted at the unit. The interested students can communicates with Dr. T.I. Mollah, the Associate NCC Officer of the unit.

10. NSS Unit: The NSS Unit of the college performs various social welfare activities in conformity with the aims and objectives of National Service Scheme, so that the students are introduced with the practical knowledge of the society through the involvement in community works. The unit provides certificates to the NSS Volunteers at special camp launched by the NSS Unit.



11. Career Counselling and Guidance Cell:

The College has an active Career Counselling and Guidance Cell. The objective of this Cell is to organize awarness and training programmes for the students of the college to enable them to avail employment opportunities. These programmers are organized with the assistance of internal as well as external resource persons.

12. Along with regular awareness sessions:

The college has also started providing Coaching for various competitive exams like Grade III, Grade IV, railway, TET etc. for imparting these classes, skilled resource persons are invited regularly to college.

13. Educational Excursions:

The students of the college are provided the opportunities to participate in educational excursions under "Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat" scheme of the Govt. of India and other schemes of the states, Govt. of Assam time to time. Besides, the institution encourages the students to participate in various academic excursions relating to their project works as per the carriculum designed by the Gauhati University and implimented by the college.

- **14. GYM**: To ensure a holistic well being of students, a fully sanctional Gym has been set up in the college. Professional trainers will be employed to guide students in proper use of gym facelities.
- **15. Incubation Centre:** The college also set up an incubation centre under District Industries and Commerce Centre (DICC). The centre aims at inculcating awareness aboil various entrepreneurial oppartunities that students can avail.
- **16. Indoor Stadium**: The college has also set up Shivaji Barua Indoor sports complex at the Matiabag Campus to provide facelities for indoor games and physical exerceses.

LIBRARY FACILITIES

Alokesh Chandra Barua Central Library:

The Central Library of the College, christened as Alokesh Chandra Barua Central Library has nearly 36,230 numbers of books including text and reference books, showcasing resources for Disciplines of Humanities, Social Sciences, Managment etc. Library users are allowed to avail its facilities through open access system.

The library has also a separate collection of books for remedial classes for all the subjects. This section contains 3000 books.



The rare books section contains a collection of 500 books mostly donated by the Royal family of Gauripur.

The endeavours to provide the college community exposure to recent trends in academic and research activities through its subscription to 15 nos of Journals, Periodical and popular magazines which includes reputed Journals like India Journal of Commerce. University News, Indian Journal of Economics and Research Frontline etc.

The central Library of the College is also well equipped with Computer System (automation) and Internet Connectivity. The UGC soul 2.0 software has been installed to manage the circulation system.

- Reading Room: The library is equipped with spacious and separate reading rooms for students and faculty members. Seating facility is available for near about 40 students in the reading room.
- 2. Book Bank facilities for poor students: This is a special initiative taken for poor meritorious student, particularly belonging to BPL categories. They are allowed to access this book bank facility in addition to the service provided to them as regular students.
- 3. E-Journal and E-Book: The library is the member of INFLIBNET and the users can access the NLIST programme of INFLIBNET which provides access to more than 2800+ E-Journals and 80000+ E-Books.
- 4. Institutional Repository System: An initiative has been taken to digitize the library documents. To that effect necessary equipments with proper software (DSPACE) has been installed. Digitization of rare books / documents is under process.
- **5. Question Bank Facilities:** Question Bank Facilities have been provided to enable the students prepare well for their final examination. Privious question papers of Gauhati University from 2011 onwards have been collected and arranged in proper order. Tha same is also available in digitized form.
- **6. Wi-Fi facilities :** Wi-Fi facilities have been provided in the library for easy access to internet connectivity.
- **7. Archival facilities :** The library is planning to preserve rare historical, cultural and literary resources to make available infrastructural support to this end.
- 8. Best Reader Award: The college has instituted the Best Reader Award in the memory of Late Debashish Biswas former librarian, P.B. College Gauripur. To inculcate better reading habits in students, the GB has resolved to give a Best Reader Award annually. On the basis of library records. The awardee will be selected.


CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The process will spread over to subsequent semesters to keep up its continuity.

5. Dialogue : The Lecture Series : The college regularly holds various programmes for the academic enhancement of the teachers and students. One such initiative is DIALOGUE – a lecture series. On every alternate Saturday, a lecture is organised in which a faculty member of college is requested to presents an academic paper. A presentation is followed by a interaction and discussion. This programme initially is started with an aim to present only the research paper by the faculty members of the

The Club will organise regular quiz competitions, debate, essay writing etc on election and voting to spread awareness. It will also organise awareness camps in nearby areas and hold mock parliament in the college to give students an idea about the working of the Parliament. 7. ECO Club: P.B. College Eco Club has been set up as a part of National Green Corps (NGC), a major initiative of Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MOEFCC) for creating environmental awareness among the community people. The Eco Club of the college organizes various activities in different environment related programmes like holding of lecture session, go green based wall-printings,



environmental awareness programme, plantation, cleanliness and the like. The Eco Club of the college encourages all immediate stakeholders for their active involvement in its different activities. The interested students can get registered as members of the Eco Club at the beginning office academics session. The students can communicate Dr. A. Islam, the Coordinator of the Eco Club. P.B. College, Gauripur.

8. Quiz and Debating Society: The Quiz and Debating Society give platform to students to hone their skill in quizzing and debating. The Society has a vibrant membership from amongst the students. Under the supervision of the Teacher Convenor, the students are encouraged to conduct quizzes and debate competitions regularly amongst themselves and at the same time represent the college at quiz and debated organized outside the college.



9. Pramathesh Barua Cine Club:

Pramathesh Barua took Gauripur to the World through his contribution in the world of cinema. To commemorate and celebrate his life and activities, the college has also formed a cine club. The cine club will works towards introducing the students to the work of Pramathesh Barua as well as



other film makers who have shaped the world of cinema. The club will focus to inculcate in students a zeal for watching, appreciating nd analyzing good cinema.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College is dedicated to promote its culture of Physical Training and Games and Sports as an Extra-curricular activity. With this aim various events of games and sports are taken up as a continuous exercise.
